**Job Description** 



Job Title: Sailing Lead Instructor

**Responsible to:** Chief Activities Officer

**Job Purpose:** To assist the Chief Activities Officer in the training and supervision of instructors, with a specific focus on sailing at CACT. Take the lead, with assistance from the Chief Activities Officer, to develop and expand the sailing opportunities CACT can offer clients.

Lead the daily staff briefings in rotation. Be available for 'duty cover' to include some evening and weekends. Be an active role model in upholding CACT's standards.

## Responsibilities

- Support the Chief Activities Officer in monitoring performance and signing off instructors via ongoing activity supervision activity.
- Develop activities and resources to further the sailing opportunities available for CACT clients.
- With support, review and amend risk assessments, policies and procedures to ensure CACT is up to date to changes from the RYA Recognised Guidance Notes, Training Notices and training conferences.
- To oversee both residential and day visit groups to ensure instructors are delivering quality activities consistent to CACT policies and procedures.
- To keep the Chief Activities Officer informed of daily operations, equipment status and instructors.
- To instruct on a wide variety of groups with a range of different outcomes.
- To be shadowed on sessions by new and existing staff as part of the sign off process and individual continued professional development.
- Act as "Duty Cover" for the Centre during some weekends, ensuring all aspects of the Trust's operations are operational.
- Complete equipment checks, focusing on sailing equipment and coordinate instructors to complete checks and other maintenance tasks.
- Be a point of contact for First Aid incidents within their ability and assist Chief Instructor/Chief Operations officer with bigger incidents inline with the EAP.
- Co-ordinate summer camps in conjunction with other Lead Instructors



- Assist in the completion of daily operational administration such as compiling group paperwork, creating daily plans and have an active role in checking programmes for errors and suitability.
- To carry out any other duties as requested by the Senior Management Team.
